

Island Green Offers Free Sustainable Deconstruction Workshops *"Taking Down Buildings to Build Up the Circular Economy"*

Community & Trade Events Take Place November 5 & 6 at UVI St. Thomas

St. John, USVI – October 22, 2021 – It is likely that 315,000+ lbs. of construction and demolition debris enter the USVI's waste stream every year, based on data from the 2019 Waste Audit conducted by Caribbean Green Technology Center (CGTC) – material that could potentially be reused and/or repurposed. <u>Island Green Living Association</u> is advancing that practice through professional and community workshops on "Sustainable Deconstruction" taking place Friday, November 5 and Saturday, November 6 on St. Thomas. The free events are supported by an EPA grant and in partnership with the CGTC.

"We're very excited to bring this opportunity to the Virgin Islands. It's a good step towards building up sustainability in the C&D industry of the VI," said Island Green Executive Director Kelly McKinney.

Sustainable deconstruction is defined as the systematic dismantling of a building in order to recover the maximum number of materials for reuse and recycling.

"Sustainable deconstruction allows 'waste' to be turned into a resource and kept out of the landfill. Not only is it good for the environment, it can also create green jobs and has the potential to foster new green business opportunities for enterprising entrepreneurs," said Harith Wickrema, President of Island Green.
