Island Green Living is a nonprofit that operates St. John's only aluminum and ocean-bound plastic recycling programs.

"Our goal for the recycling program is to increase awareness and participation by the community, both residents and those visiting," Wickrema said.

Since its inception in February 2022, the recycling program has collected

70,000 pounds of ocean-bound plastics, and more than 3 million aluminum

The organization also runs the Resource Depot, which has saved nearly 1,000,000 pounds of building materials, furnishings, and clothing from the landfill.

"We'd also love to see more volunteers — we can always use an extra pair of hands to help with sorting and crushing, as well as in our ReSource Depot reuse store," Wickrema said.

He also noted that this year the organization's Earth Day theme is "PLANET vs. PLASTICS" and they plan to host a seminar on April 22 at Gifft Hill School.

Wickrema said recycling drop off points are available at the Resource Depot behind VITEMA on Gifft Hill Road, and at specially marked bins at these locations:

- Cruz Bay: Main VIWMA site across from EC Gas Station & Alfredo's Landscaping
- Gifft Hill Road: VIWMA site just past Gifft Hill School
- Coral Bay: Main VIWMA site across from Love City Mini Mart
- Bin at Caneel Bay Fuel Dock in Cruz Bay
